Danielle's Foundation realizes how difficult it is for parents of children with cerebral palsy and brain injury to get their children the therapies and medical equipment they desperately need. In an effort to provide financial assistance, each quarter one deserving family will be awarded a grant of typically \$2,000 (although it can range up to \$5,000 depending on the funds the foundation has available) to help get this necessary care that insurance has denied.

The grant will be given out four times a year, with the following deadlines:

- March 31
- June 30
- September 30
- December 31

Your child must have a diagnosis of cerebral palsy or brain injury, and you must be requesting the grant for assistance towards a specific therapy or medical equipment. For more information and to receive an application please contact their toll free hotline **1.800.996.1148**

A potential resource for children throughout the United States who are under age 18 and do not have adequate health insurance. Financial assistance provided for assistive devices and rehabilitation services. Although there are no restrictions on the type or eligible disabilities, preference is given to applications that benefit children with physical challenges in need of prosthetic and other assistive devices (not computers). The amount of financial assistance is generally between \$25 and \$200 and is most often for wheelchairs, orthopedic braces, walkers, lifts, hearing aids, eyeglasses, medical equipment, physical therapy, and surgery.

Kya's Crusade provides two types of Financial Assistance Grants to help families with expenses not covered by insurance:

1. Adaptive Equipment [Up To \$1,000]
2. Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Hippotherapy Sessions [Up To \$500]

Who is eligible to receive financial assistance?

Children under the age of 18 with a confirmed diagnosis of a life-long physical disability affecting the child's motor skills, for which physical/occupational therapy is part of the treatment regimen, are eligible to receive financial assistance. - The United Healthcare Children's Foundation offers support to meet the needs of children nationwide with financial assistance grants for health care services that are not fully covered by their health insurance. Parents and caretakers are eligible to apply for grants of up to \$5,000.00 for health care services that will help improve a child's quality of life.

The child needing services must:

- Be under 17yrs. of age and live in any United Healthcare region of the United States
- Be covered by a commercial health insurance policy (available through an employer)
- Have an insurance policy that has limitations on the health care service needed, does not cover the service at all, and/or the required co-payments will be a serious financial burden on the family
- Live in a family whose adjusted gross income does not exceed \$20, 000 for each individual in the home
- There are no other financial resources to meet this health care need
